






Water damage and use of cardboard to back photo.

Documentation - Condition of the piece as it was found.







Documentation – As picture was disassembled for restoration and conservation.












Documentation – Dirt and condition of the photo as seen when disassembled.








What would you decide?


Cleaning Photograph


Cleaning – avoid further damage, carefully remove all dirt, insects and residue












Completing the process of Restoration & Preservation
